NOTICE OF INTENT TO REQUEST RELEASE OF FUNDS**

These notices shall satisfy two separate but related procedural requirements for activities to be undertaken by the St. Clair County Intergovernmental Grants Department.

REQUEST FOR RELEASE OF FUNDS

On or about April 2, 2026 the St. Clair County Intergovernmental Grants Department will submit a request to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) for the release of CDBG-DR funds under The Further Additional Supplemental Appropriations for Disaster Relief Requirements Act, 2018 (Public Law 115–123); Additional Supplemental Appropriations for Disaster Relief Act, 2019 (Pub. L. 116–20) as amended, to undertake the following project:

<p>Project Name: East Carondelet Detention Pond and Drainage Project</p> <p>Project Location: East Carondelet, IL – Saint Clair County -State Street Approx 100FT South of North 11th Street -Along Davis Ferry Road Approx 1,700FT South of Bottom Road -The "15th Street Right of Way" is located between 14th Street and Kellings Farm Road -Along Wisconsin Street near what would have been the extension of South 8th Street. -Open Greenspace East of 5th and 6th Streets just South of Levee Road and just East of Illinois Street</p> <p>Project Description: The project consists of five sites. Site A involves replacement of the failed and collapsed culvert located 100FT south of North 11th Street. The existing will be replaced with a 40FT long by 24-inch diameter under State Street and creating a more defined ditch to direct the water southerly towards Wisconsin Ave and Prairie DuPont Levee District. Site B is located along Davis Ferry Road approx. 1,770FT south of Bottom Road, where a 40FT and 24" diameter culvert will be installed crossing Davis Ferry Road to the existing ditches along the northerly side of the street. Site C is located at an area known as 15th Street. This right of way was for a street that was never constructed between 14th Street and Kellings Farm Road. Currently there is a drainage path that flows through this right of way via an overgrown and unmaintained ditch, The idea is to use the existing ROW to realign the ditch to provide a more suitable flow path to the village storm system. This will entail approx. 450FT of grading and reshaping. Site D consists of replacing two aging pumps at the existing pump station located along Wisconsin Ave near what would have been the extension of 8th Street. Site E involves construction of a detention pond with the capacity of 80,000 cubic yards of storage. Storm water control structures to retain and convey stormwater from the 5th Street Station and/or to the gravity pipe under the levee. Tree removal and clearing will be necessary. The extent of the work being done will include ground disturbing activities at all site other than Site D.</p>

FINDING OF NO SIGNIFICANT IMPACT

The St. Clair County Intergovernmental Grants Department has determined that the projects will have no significant impact affecting the quality of the human environment. Therefore, an Environmental Impact Statement under the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969 (NEPA) is not required. PUBLIC COMMENTS

Any individual, group, or agency may submit written comments on the ERR to the St. Clair County Intergovernmental Grants Department. All comments received by April 1, 2026 will be considered by the St. Clair County Intergovernmental Grants Department prior to authorizing submission of a request for release of funds. Comments should specify which Notice they are addressing.

ENVIRONMENTAL CERTIFICATION

The St. Clair County Intergovernmental Grants Department certifies to HUD that Mark A. Kern in his official capacity as Chairman, St. Clair County Board consents to accept the jurisdiction of the Federal Courts if an action is brought to enforce responsibilities in relation to the environmental review process and that these responsibilities have been satisfied. HUD's approval of the certification satisfies its responsibilities under NEPA and related laws and authorities and allows the St. Clair County to use Program funds.

OBJECTIONS TO RELEASE OF FUNDS

HUD will accept objections to its release of fund and the St. Clair County Intergovernmental Grants Department certification for a period of fifteen days following the anticipated submission date or its actual receipt of the request (whichever is later) only if they are on one of the following bases: (a) the certification was not executed by the Certifying Officer of the St. Clair County Intergovernmental Grants Department; (b) the St. Clair County Intergovernmental Grants Department has omitted a step or failed to make a decision or finding required by HUD regulations at 24 CFR part 58; (c) the grant recipient or other participants in the development process have committed funds, incurred costs or undertaken activities not authorized by 24 CFR Part 58 before approval of a release of funds by HUD; or (d) another Federal agency acting pursuant to 40 CFR Part 1504 has submitted a written finding that the project is unsatisfactory from the standpoint of environmental quality. Objections must be prepared and submitted in accordance with the required procedures (24 CFR Part 58, Sec. 58.76) and shall be addressed to HUD at 77 West Jackson Blvd, Chicago, IL 60604-3507.
