

**Early Notice and Public Review of a Proposed
Activity in a Federal Flood Risk Management Standard Designated Floodplain or Wetland**

To: All interested Agencies, Groups and Individuals

This is to give notice that St. Clair County Intergovernmental Grants Department under 24 CFR Part 58 has determined that the following proposed action under Community Development Block Grant Disaster Recovery(CDBG-DR) and HUD grant number B-23-UN-17-0001 is located in the Federal Flood Risk Management Standard (FFRMS) floodplain / wetland, and Saint Clair County Intergovernmental Grants will be identifying and evaluating practicable alternatives to locating the action within the floodplain/wetland and the potential impacts on the floodplain/wetland from the proposed action, as required by Executive Order 11988, as amended by Executive Order 13690 and/or Executive Order 11990, in accordance with HUD regulations at 24 CFR 55.20 in Subpart C Procedures for Making Determinations on Floodplain Management and Protection of Wetlands. See proposed project locations below:

Village of Dupu	The extent of the FFRMS floodplain was determined using the freeboard value approach. The project will consist of constructing a storm water pump station next to a village storm collection basin on the west side of North 5th Street, install a new 24" diameter storm water pipe below North 5th Street that will discharge into a farm field, the installation of additional conveyance piping north of the collection basin to improve drainage away from Strone Drive and Lime Street. With the addition of a new storm water pump station and extensive work being completed, this project will include ground disturbance. There are three primary purposes for this notice. First, people who may be affected by activities in floodplain/wetland and those who have an interest in the protection of the natural environment should be given an opportunity to express their concerns and provide information about these areas. Commenters are encouraged to offer alternative sites outside of the floodplain/wetland, alternative methods to serve the same project purpose, and methods to minimize and mitigate project impacts on the floodplain/wetland. Second, an adequate public notice program can be an important public educational tool. The dissemination of information and request for public comment about floodplain/wetland can facilitate and enhance Federal efforts to reduce the risks and impacts associated with the occupancy and modification of these special areas. Third, as a matter of fairness, when the Federal government determines it will participate in actions taking place in floodplain/wetland, it must inform those who may be put at greater or continued risk.
