Emergency Readiness / Public Safety Committee
June 2026/ July 2026

Per the St. Clair County EMA Report Herb Simmons presented the following.

1. All monthly radio tests were conducted, and no problems were noted.
2. Monthly tests of the outdoor warning sirens were completed. As part of the continual engineering review of the siren system, four sirens were identified to possibly need replacement radio equipment. ATI Solutions sent a test unit which will be installed temporarily on each unit to determine if it corrects the communication warnings. If it does, replacements will be sent and installed permanently.
3. Attended the Monthly Starcom 21 Committee Meeting
4. Attended the STARRS Board Meeting.
5. Attended the Statewide Interoperable Executive Committee Meeting.
6. Attended meeting of the Statewide 9-1-1 Advisory Board.
7. Attended the monthly meeting of the St. Clair Special Emergency Services.
8. Staff attended the quarterly regional meeting for Illinois Emergency Management.
9. Attend monthly meetings of the Long-Term Recovery Division of our County COAD (Community Organization Active in Disaster).
10. Conducted the bi-monthly meeting of the Local Emergency Planning Committee (LEPC).
11. Continue to work with IEMA/FEMA on the Belleville and East Carondelet Flood Studies along with the Flood Buyout Program. Our engineering firm is beginning the process of developing the fair market value offers for the first 35 homes to be presented to the owners.
12. Continue to conduct the Monday Morning Spotlight St Clair Episodes.
13. EMA staff continues to attend planning meetings for Fair St. Clair.
14. St. Clair County Mobile Command Post deployed to support the St. Clair County Sherriff Dept, Illinois State Police, St Clair County Coroner's Office, St Louis City Police and the FBI with an investigation.
15. The EMA Bus was deployed to Touchette Elderly Apartments to assist with displaced residents from a power outage.

ST. CLAIR COUNTY SHERIFF DEPARTMENT

Major Lee Graham reported the following for the month of May 01, 2026, ending May 31, 2026, which included the following data: Average Daily Population was 420. There were 783 inmates admitted of those 218 were females, and 564 were males, 325 misdemeanors, 319 felons, 8 Federal, 109 fugitives, and 1 Transcor. There were 7 Sentence Weekend Bookings, 1 Sentence County Bookings, 8 D.O.C. and 5 Other. There were 303 traffic citations, 319 traffic warnings, 115 felony/misdemeanors/warrant arrests, 639 park patrols, 1249 business checks, and 12 courthouse checks, for a total of 997 points of contact with the general public.
